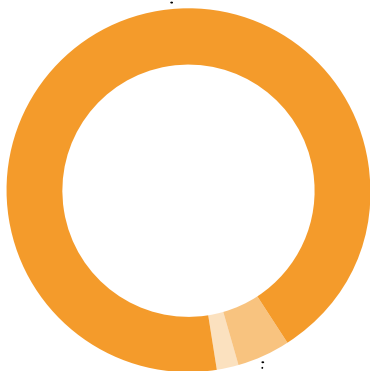

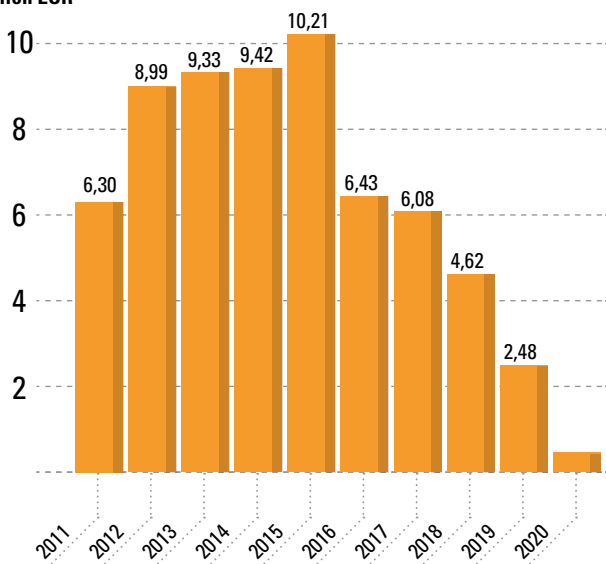

cooperation in Vietnam

Luxembourg has been active in Vietnam for 22 years.

The progress made by Vietnam, in development terms, over the years has been considerable and the country reached the middle-income status in 2011. In the light of Vietnam's development progress, Luxembourg's grant based ODA will phase out and the two countries are striving to diversify their partnership.

The third Indicative Cooperation Programme (ICP III) came to an end in 2015, but some strategic activities continue, aiming to explore avenues for the diversification of the relations between Luxembourg and Vietnam.

Providing Technical Assistance and other types of support to increase the efficiency and effectiveness of the International Fund for Agricultural Development loan in Tuyen Quang province.

Bac Kan Vocational Training and Education - 2,500,000 €

Continuing support for the vocational and education center in Bac Kan.

BBI – Scholarships – 1,260,000 €

Providing scholarships for students and teachers in tourism and hospitality, for an annual training at the BBI, a school for hospitality and tourism business in Wiltz.

Luxembourg - highly committed

Development cooperation has been one of the foundations of Luxembourg's foreign policy since 1980. Luxembourg allocates 1% of its gross national income to support the most disadvantaged populations – this places it among the most ambitious developed economies in this sector. Luxembourg's development cooperation is geared towards targeted partnerships and founded on key principles such as reliability, commitment and capability, while its activity is long-term, in line with the principles of sustainability and aid effectiveness.
